



Craft 3: Wildlife Puzzle

Each wild animal is like a puzzle piece in our environment. Whenever one is missing, the whole picture is not complete. Likewise, whenever an animal goes extinct or gets taken away from their home, a piece of our environment goes missing, disrupting ecosystems.

The Jane Goodall Act works to ensure that animals that belong in the wild stay in the wild, making sure that the puzzle is missing fewer pieces.

Items needed:

1. rectangular piece of cardboard (you can cut the flap of a cardboard delivery box for this!)
2. scissors
3. something to colour with (markers, crayons, pencil crayons)

*Adult supervision required

Instructions:

Step 1: cut a piece of cardboard into a rectangular shape.

Step 2: Using your preferred colouring materials (paint, pencil crayons, etc...), draw your favourite animals on the cardboard! You can even write a message in the middle sharing how much you love wildlife!

Step 3: Cut grooves into the cardboard, it doesn't need to be perfect, just make sure that each piece is unique so you can put it back together later. You can make the pieces as big or small as you'd like. Keep in mind, the smaller the pieces, the harder the puzzle will be!

Step 4: It's time to do your puzzle! When you're done, you can save the pieces in a reusable bag such as a plastic bag or paper bag.
